The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Detective Investigator positions located in Buffalo. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated, and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

SOMB conducts civil litigation necessary to either commit dangerous sex offenders to institutions, or to enable the state to manage those offenders under supervision who are not in custody. In furtherance of that litigation, SOMB is routinely called upon to conduct detailed investigations into the underlying facts of an offender's crimes and into the offender's entire history.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must have at least ten (10) years of prior law enforcement experience.
- Have current NYS basic police academy certification approved by DCJS or the ability to successfully complete all
 requirements to obtain NYS basic police academy certification.
- Must possess a valid NYS Driver's License with ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- The NYS Public Officer's Law requires that all police officers be citizens of the United States of America and reside within the State of New York at the time of appointment.
- Expertise in interviewing victims of sexual assault, especially the elderly, children and adults, and extensive experience interviewing perpetrators of sexual assaults.
- Experience at the Detective level with a specialty in Sex Offenses.
- Extensive experience testifying as a witness in courts in sexual abuse cases.
- Experience tracking down unreported sexual assault victims.
- Established contacts within the law enforcement community in the Western New York State area.

The annual salary for this position is \$75,348. This position is overtime eligible. Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.

Candidates from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
